To the Congress of the United States:

I hereby withdraw the 33 rescission proposals transmitted to the Congress by the Carter Administration on January 15, 1981 totalling \$1,142.4 million and temporarily convert them to deferrals. A list of the withdrawn rescission proposals is attached.

The conversion to temporary deferrals will provide my Administration with the opportunity to review and revise these proposals within the context of my overall plan to curtail the growth of government and reduce Federal spending.

In addition, I am reporting four other new deferrals totalling \$8.0 million and a revision to a previously transmitted deferral increasing the amount deferred by \$51.1 million. These four new items involve programs in the Departments of the Interior and Transportation and the International Communication Agency. The revision to the existing deferral involves the Department of the Treasury.

The details of the deferrals are contained in the attached reports.

## JUSTIFICATION

The Interior and Related Agencies Appropriation Act for 1981, (Public Law 96-514) includes an indefinite no-year appropriation equivalent to 25 percent of timber sale receipts from revested Oregon and California Railroad grant lands. The appropriated receipts provide for management, development, and protection of Federal Oregon and California grant lands including the construction and maintenance of roads. Because the appropriation is based on receipts collected in the same fiscal period and the receipts are based on the timber harvested, the total amount which will be available for obligation can only be estimated. Not only may actual receipts vary from estimates, but receipts for the last two months of the fiscal period are not known in time to make programmatic adjustments to offset a possible shortfall between estimated and actual amounts. Deferral is planned to cushion fluctuations in receipt levels.

Receipts for fiscal year 1980 were \$195,214,247 with an unobligated balance of \$2,548,562 brought forward into fiscal year 1981. Total budgetary resources for this program are \$60,048,562. Public Law 96-514, however, provides for obligation of no more than \$58,200,000 in fiscal year 1981. Consequently, the balance of \$1,848,652 has been reserved for use in fiscal year 1982. This deferral action is taken in accordance with the Antideficiency Act (31 U.S.C. 665).

Because of the difficulty in ending such a complex and massive undertaking, termination has taken a number of years. Settlement is being accomplished as quickly as possible consistent with the legitimate claims of the contractors and the protection of government interests. The deferred funds will not be needed for obligation during this fiscal year and are reserved for use in fiscal year 1982.

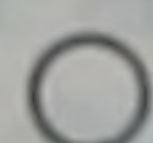
