Tree community analyzed by demographic parameters of component species in a temperate deciduous forest  
Abstract:

We have collected the demographic parameter through the whole life cycle of 20 co-occurring tree species for about 10 years in an old-growth temperate deciduous forest, Ogawa Forest Reserve, central Japan. Seed size seedling emergence, growth and mortality of seedlings, saplings and adult trees, reproductive schedules, gap dependency and other demographic parameters were analyzed among the species to discuss the coexistence mechanisms. We found two large tradeoffs possible to be important mechanisms to enable their coexistence in this forest. One is the tradeoff between fecundity and survival in young stage, and another is that between the adult population turnover and maximum size. The former enables the coexistence in terms of disturbance, and the latter causes the habitat segregation among different stories in the forest structure.
