NOTES OF CAUTION TO BOAT USERS

Facilities management is spending approximately \$15,000 a year in outboard motor parts, which constitutes a problem. Several factors could explain this. 1) Due to their construction, outboard motor engines are very sensitive to misuse, 2) hidden objects in the lake can strike and damage the motors, and 3) often users are not informed on proper use of outboard motors. The STRI Maintenance Department urges users to take the following measures. Become informed about procedures to follow when using outboard motors. For example, give sufficient time for the engine to heat and make sure it has the correct oil/gas mixture. Only change gears at the lowest possible revolutions. If the engine is making strange noises, or if water is noticed inside the plastic filter, do not use the motor, and please report the problem. When using a boat outside the marked area be observant of stumps that could damage it. By following these simple instructions and taking better care our outboard motors we could greatly eliminate the expense of time and money that this represents.

BIOTELEMETRY WORKSHOP
