Tuesday, September 27, noon seminar speaker will be MICHAEL KELLER, Princeton University.

#### Tropical Biogeochemistry and Global Atmosphere.

Abstract: The current chemical composition of the atmosphere is maintained by biological processes. High rates of productivity and a nutrient cycling in tropical environments make interactions between tropical biota and the atmosphere particularly significant on a global scale. Nitrous oxide and methane, two of the most important "greenhouse" gases, have strong sources and sinks in the tropics. Estimates of biosphere-atmosphere fluxes of these gases will be presented for unperturbed ecosystems. The influence of deforestation on these gases will be considered.

A cold lunch will then be offered, and at 1:00 p.m., BERT DRAKE, Smithsonian Institution, will give a second seminar.

## <u>NEW PANAMA NATIONAL PARKS /</u> <u>NUEVOS PARQUES NACIONALES EN</u> <u>PANAMA</u>

Two new national parks have been declared by the board of directors of INRENARE: La Amistad International Park, in the provinces of Bocas del Toro and Chiriqui, with more than 500,000 acres of forest, and Marine National Park Bastimentos, in the Province of Bocas del Toro, with 35,000 acres of coastal habitats. Both areas are known for their great biological diversity.

La Junta Directiva de INRENARE, mediante las resoluciones JD021-88 y JD022-88, ha establecido por ley dos nuevos parques, el Parque Internacional La Amistad en las provincia de Bocas del Toro y Chiriquí, con mas de 200,000 hectareas de bosque tropical, y el Parque Nacional Marino Isla Bastimentos en la Provincia de Bocas del Toro, con 15,000 hectareas de habitats costeros. (Gaceta Oficial No. 21,129 del 6 de septiembre 1988.) Ambas areas han sido reconocidas mundialmente por su extraordinaria riqueza biologica.
