She has served as National Director of Technical Information and Training at the Institute of Agricultural Research in Panama since 1985, and is a member of Panamanian, inter-American and international associations of librarians and documentalists. She has written several reports on agricultural information. Ms. Chang-Yau was awarded a Bachelor of Arts degree by Keuka College in New York where she majored in Biology with minor fields in zoology, botany and ecology. She earned a Master's of Arts degree in Communications for Social Development at the University of Chicago.




