Tuesday, May 22, noon seminar speakers will be Anne Meylan, Florida Marine Research Institute, and Peter Meylan, Eckerd College.

Studies of marine turtles in Bocas del Toro Province, 1979-1989.

Abstract

Bocas del Toro Province provides nesting, foraging and/or developmental habitat for four species of marine turtles. Our early studies documented the abundance, distribution and seasonality of the fauna. The province hosts one of the largest nesting populations of Dermochelys coriacea in the Caribbean and serves as a migratory station for green turtles en route to the colonial nesting beach at Tortuguero, Costa Rica. It also once supported one of the few known sites of aggregated nesting by the hawksbill turtle, but this population has been nearly extirpated by harvesting for the tortoiseshell Our current studies aim to corroborate and refine a generalized life history model for marine turtles that includes several seasonal and ontogenetic changes in habitat occupation. Since 1989 we have sampled subadult populations of three species in Chiriqui Lagoon to determine population size structure, site fidelity, growth rates, sex ratios, and migratory movements. We are using laparoscopy to study the chronology of reproductive maturation in these long-lived species. Recoveries of tagged turtles are expected to establish that immature green turtles in Chiriqui Lagoon are part of the Tortuguero population. The origin of the loggerheads in the lagoon is unknown, there being no nearby nesting locality for this species. In June 1990, we will expand netting efforts to Zapatilla Cays to target the migratory "flotilla" of adult green turtles bound for Tortuguero.


