

Reassignment of Duties

Cambios en la Administración

As part of the administrative reorganization at STRI, Director Ira Rubinoff announced the assignments of Leopoldo León as Comptroller of STRI and Leonor Motta as Executive and Legal Officer of the Institute. Leopoldo will answer directly to the director and will be in charge of Accounting, Procurement and the implementation of the current budget. He will continue as grant manager of STRI, liaison with the office of Sponsored Projects and should be consulted early in the preparation of grants. Leonor will be in charge of financial planning, the development of the budget and will provide legal counsel within STRI as well as coordinating with SI General Counsel. She will direct the Human Resources Office, the telecommunications program and all business operations at STRI. In his announcement, dated Dec 17, Rubinoff requests everybody's cooperation in this phase of the reorganization • • • Como parte de la reorganización administrativa en STRI, Ira Rubinoff anunció los nombramientos de Leopoldo León como Contralor en STRI y de Leonor Motta como Directora Administrativa y Legal del Instituto. Leopoldo trabajará directamente bajo el director y estará a cargo de las Oficinas de Contabilidad y Compras, y de ejecutar el presupuesto. Seguirá siendo el administrador de subsidios en STRI, el enlace con la Oficina de Proyectos Subsidiados y deberá consultársele temprano en la preparación de subsidios. Leonor tendrá a su cargo los planes financieros, el desarrollo del presupuesto y suministrará asesoría legal dentro de STRI y con el Consejo General de Washington. También dirigirá la Oficina de Recursos Humanos, el programa de telecomunicaciones y las operaciones comerciales en STRI. En su noticia del 17 de diciembre, Rubinoff pidió la cooperación de todos en esta fase de la reorganización.

Energy Research Financial Assistance

The Office of Basic Energy Sciences of the Office of Energy Research (ER), U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) announces its interest in receiving preapplications from

potential applicants for research funding in the Energy Biosciences program area. Areas of interest include bioenergetic systems, including photosynthesis; control of plant growth and development, including metabolic, genetic, and hormonal and ambient factor regulation, metabolic diversity, stress physiology and adaptation; genetic transmission and expression; plant-microbial interactions, plant cell wall structure and function; lignocellulose degradative mechanisms; mechanisms of fermentations, genetics of neglected microorganisms, energetics and membrane phenomena; thermophily (molecular basis of high temperature tolerance); microbial interactions; and one-carbon metabolism, which is the basis of biotransformation such as methanogenesis. Help "Stamp"-Out Hunger!


