Archaeological Session at the XIII National Scientific Congress

On August 31, from 9:45 am to 12:15 pm, at the Department of Humanities of the University of Panamá, eight lectures will be presented as part of the Arqueological Session of the XIII National Scientific Congress. These lectures summarize recent archaeological research in Panama sponsored by the INAC and STRI, under the supervision of Dr. Richard Cooke. Subjects include fishing and precolombian hunting, results from excavations at Cerro Juan Diaz, evolution of precolombian ceramics in the Central Region of Panama and archaeological research at Chame.
