THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

From the Visitor Services Office

The census of the 50 hectares plot on BCI will start on Sunday, January 1, 1995, and is expected to end in December 1995. During this time, there will be a large number of local assistants commuting to BCI on weekdays. Because of limitation in the capacity of the launch (*Jacana*) we have had to make changes in our Visiting Policy, as follows: 1) The Regular Tuesday Visitors' Tours have been changed to Sundays. On Sundays, therefore, we will be having one guided tour group of no more than 15 persons. On Sundays we will also be able to schedule no more than 2 "guest" groups. These "guest" groups will allow STRI employees to take their friends and relatives to visit BCI. Each of these groups must be scheduled in advance, through the VSO, on a first-come, first-serve basis. Each group is limited to five persons, including the host/hostess who must accompany the group and be its guide. These groups cannot be attached to the Regular Visitors Tour. Whenever possible, we will also schedule "guest" groups on STRI Holidays, when there will be more space on the *Jacana*. 2) On Saturdays we will continue to have two Regular Visitor Tours, of no more than 15 persons

REMEMBER TO BRING PARTY'S TICKET 1 **RECUERDE EL BOLETO DE LA FIESTA**

15 persons each. No other visitors will be scheduled on Saturdays. 3) STRI employees may request spaces on the Regular Visitors Tours, as well, and will be accommodated when space is available. 4) Visitors can not be scheduled on weekdays. The few remaining empty seats on the *Jacana* must be kept available for STRI staff and visitors that need to go to BCI to do research or on official business. These visits should be coordinated, in advance, with Daniel Millán, to ascertain availability of space on the *Jacana* for that specific date. Failure to do so may mean someone being left at the dock due to lack of a seat. *Note: Launch operators have strict instructions not to leave the dock with more people than the vessel is licensed to carry.* 5) VIP and Special Visits must be coordinated by the Protocol Office, in coordination with the VSO. Such visits may require special boat runs.

We know that these limitations may mean postponing or rescheduling of plans, but we would greatly appreciate everyone's cooperation with these new procedures.



OPENING FOR A FORESTRY ECONOMIST

The Harvard Institute for International Development (HIID) of Harvard University and the STRI's Center for Tropical Forest Science (CTFS) announce the opening of a position for a Forestry Economist to design and carry out socioeconomic and policy research on issues of tropical forest valuation and management. The position is based at the HIID in Cambridge, MA, but it involves considerable travel (three-four months a year) to CTFS research sites in Latin America, Asia, and Africa, and close collaboration with both HIID resource economists and CTFS natural scientists. The HIID/CTFS position is for an initial period of 3 years with prospects for renewal depending on performance. **Qualifications:** Ph.D. in Forestry Economics or Resource Economics or other areas of economics such as Agricultural Economics with prior experience in forestry economics research. Working knowledge of non-market valuations methods is essential. The main working language is English, but working knowledge of Spanish or French is an advantage. The successful candidate will have strong research skills, keen interest in international development and in tropical forests, and the ability to work as part of a team from different disciplines and cultures.
