## TUPPER CENTER SEMINARS

Tuesday, Jun 20, noon seminar speaker will be Richard Cooke, STRI. *Excavations at Cerro Juan Diaz, a Precolumbian village on the Bay of Parita, Panama: Report on field work undertaken in 1992-1995 with comments on its relevance to the study of Precolumbian social complexity*

### Abstract

Since 1992, I have been supervising excavations at Cerro Juan Diaz, a large Precolumbian village located at the mouth of the La Villa, on the southern edge of Parita Bay (Central Pacific Panama). This research is a joint project sponsored by the National Institute of Culture, Panama, the Smithsonian Institution, STRI, and the National Geographic Society. Archaeologists in charge are Luis Alberto Sanchez, Ilean Isaza, and Aguilaro Perez. I shall present a summary of research results to date. The first part of the talk will describe the most important features at the site, which consist of both domestic and funerary contexts. These correspond to three periods: AD 400-650; ca AD 800; and the contact period. In the second part, I will speculate about the relevance of Cerro Juan Diaz to the study of Precolumbian social complexity in tropical lowland America, emphasizing the impact of trade in exotic marine shells and metalwork upon social organization.
