NEWS ON FOREST RESERVES

The forest through which the El Llano-Cartí Road (Chepo to Atlantic side) passes contains very interesting biological phenomena, some of which have Colombian and Amazonian affinities. The forest is being rapidly destroyed by squatters and the KUNA have expressed their interest in preserving the forest within the Comarca de San Blas. STRI is being asked to lend its scientific expertise to participate in general biological surveys of the region. Richard Huber of the Yale School of Forestry is here to help with the planning of the project.
