AMLC Meeting Congreso de AMLC

The 29th Meeting of the Association of Marine Laboratories of the Caribbean (AMLC) will be held from July 18th to July 24th, 1999 at the Instituto Oceanográfico de Venezuela, Universidad de Oriente in Cumaná, Venezuela. The AMLC meeting will aid in celebrating the 40th anniversary of the Instituto. The meetings' objectives are the presentation of marine research carried out in the region and the exchange of ideas among the scientific community of the Caribbean focusing on marine science, including all aspects of marine biology (physiology, ecology, genetics, systematics), oceanography (biological, chemical, physical), marine pollution and ecotoxicology, aquaculture, fisheries biology, and

natural products. Presentations will be in English and Spanish. Detailed instructions for the submission of abstracts will be included in the second circular but submission date will be May 30th. Papers may be submitted for a special issue of the *Revista de Biología Tropical*. For additional information contact Mary I. El Congreso de AMLC se celebra junto con el 40 aniversario del Instituto. Los objetivos del congreso son la presentación de investigaciones marinas que se llevan a cabo en el área y el intercambio de ideas entre la comunidad científica del Caribe en las áreas de ciencias marinas incluyendo todos los aspectos de la biología marina (fisiología, ecología, genética y sistemática) oceanografía (biológica, química y física) contaminación de los mares y toxicología ecológica, acuacultura, biología pesquera y productos naturales. Las presentaciones serán en inglés y en español. Las instrucciones para someter resúmenes serán publicadas en la segunda circular del congreso, pero la fecha límite para someterlos es el 30 de mayo.
