FY 2010 Highlights

October

The Dibner Library of the History of Science and Technology receives state-of-the-art digital scanning equipment to allow rare items to be copied for readers without damage.

November

Director Nancy E. Gwinn participates in a strategic review committee for the Natural History Museum Library and Archives in London. The Barona Band of Mission Indians donates the Barona Intertribal Dictionary, the first publication of the Barona Museum Press, to the National Museum of the American Indian Library.

December

The Libraries receives a pledge of \$1.5 million from the Smithsonian's Atherton Seidell Endowment to support participation in the Biodiversity Heritage Library.

Lee Rainie, Director, Pew Internet & American Life Project, lectures on "How to Survive in the New Media Ecology."
