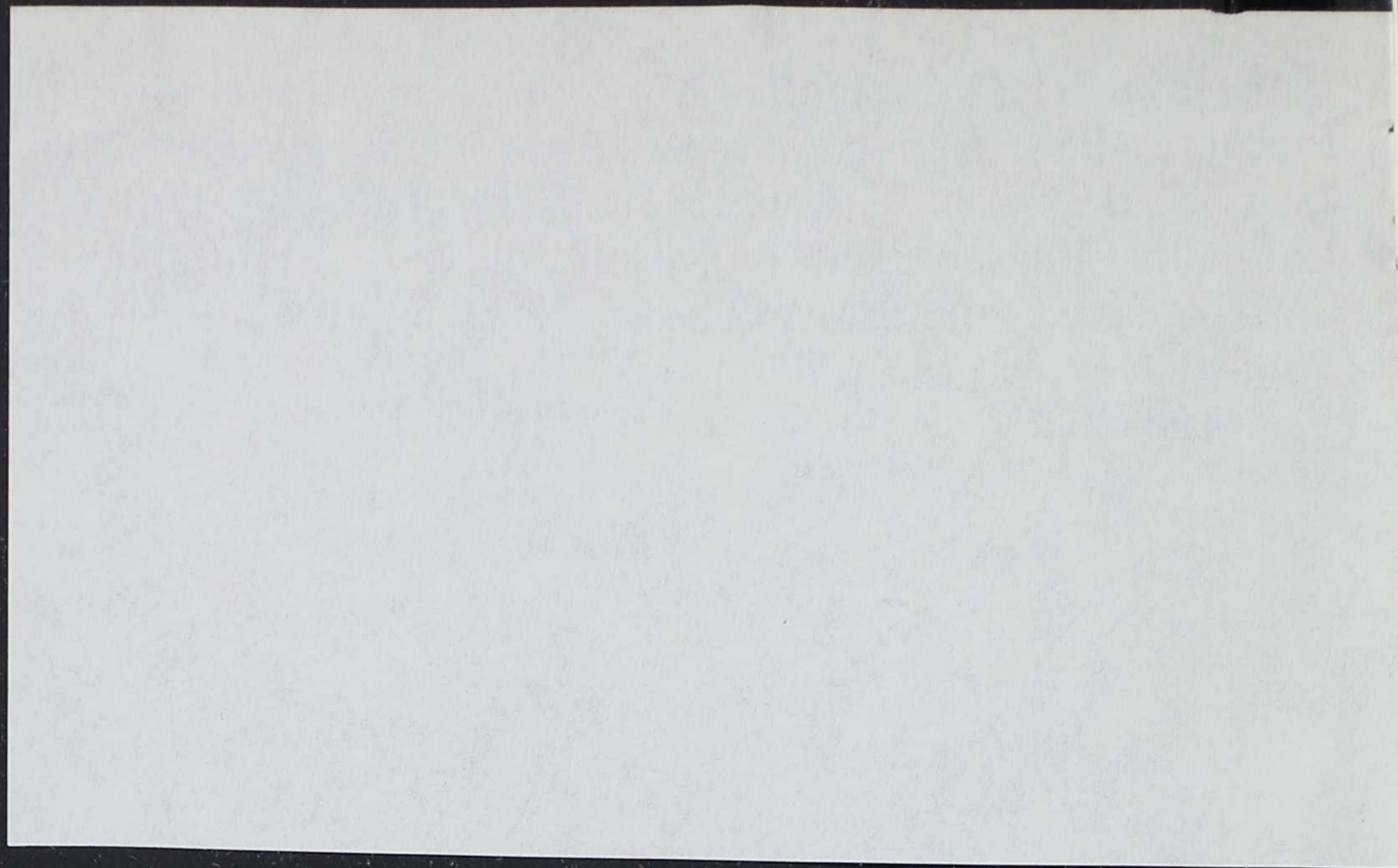

Mr. WHITTEN, from the Committee on Appropriations, submitted the following

REPORT

[To accompany H.J. Res. 394]

This resolution extends the current continuing resolution (Public Law 100-120) from November 10, 1987 through November 20, 1987. This action is necessary to provide additional time to complete the appropriations process. It is also necessary to allow time for the development of a comprehensive, bipartisan budget agreement between the Congress and the Administration.

Prompt action on this resolution is necessary because the provisions of the existing continuing resolution will expire at midnight on November 10, 1987.

Under the terms of Public Law 100-120, as regular annual bills are enacted they disengage from the provisions of the continuing resolution. Consequently, a simple date change to the existing continuing resolution appears to be the appropriate course of action.

INFLATIONARY IMPACT STATEMENT

Clause 2(1)(4) of Rule XI of the House of Representatives requires that each Committee report on a bill or resolution shall contain a statement as to whether enactment of such bill or resolution may have an inflationary impact on prices and costs in the operation of the national economy.

In view of the levels of funding which obtain under the mechanics of this resolution which simply extends the existing continuing resolution through November 20, 1987, it is the judgment of the Committee that its enactment will not have an inflationary impact on prices and costs in the operation of the national economy.

In compliance with Clause 3 of Rule XIII of the Rules of the House of Representatives, changes in existing law made by the joint resolution are shown as follows (existing law proposed to be omitted is enclosed in black brackets, new matter is printed in italic, and existing law in which no change is proposed is shown in roman):

Section 102 of the continuing appropriations resolution for fiscal year 1988 (Public Law 100-120) is amended as follows:

SEC. 102. Unless otherwise provided for in this joint resolution or in the applicable appropriations Act, appropriations and funds made available and authority granted pursuant to this joint resolution shall be available until (a) enactment into law of an appropriation for any project or activity provided for in this joint resolution, or (b) enactment of the applicable appropriations Act by both Houses without any provision for such project or activity, or (c) **[November 10, 1987]** *November 20, 1987* whichever first occurs.

- 2 shall be in order to consider, section 302(f) of the Congres-
- 3 sional Budget Act of 1974, as amended (Public Law 93-

- 5 notwithstanding, the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 394) making
- 6 further continuing appropriations for the fiscal year 1988,
- 7 and for other purposes, in the House. Debate on the joint

1 resolution shall continue not to exceed one hour, to be equal-  
2 ly divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minor-  
3 ity member of the Committee on Appropriations. The amend-  
4 ment printed in section 2 of this resolution shall be consid-  
5 ered to have been adopted. No other amendment shall be in  
6 order except the amendment printed in section 3 of this reso-  
7 lution, by and if offered by, Representative Bonior of Michi-  
8 gan, which shall be debatable for not to exceed sixty minutes,  
9 equally divided and controlled by the proponent and a  
10 Member opposed thereto. The previous question shall be con-  
11 sidered as ordered on the joint resolution and amendments  
12 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except  
13 one motion to recommit, which may not contain instructions.

14 SEC. 2. On page 1, line 6 strike "November 20, 1987"  
15 and insert in lieu thereof "December 16, 1987".

16 SEC. 3. At the end of the joint resolution, insert the  
17 following:

18 SEC. 2. Section 101(a)(1) of the joint resolution of Sep-  
19 tember 30, 1987 (Public Law 100-120), is amended by in-  
20 serting before the semicolon at the end of the paragraph re-  
21 lating to military construction appropriations: " : *Provided*  
22 *further*, That any new assistance shall be provided consistent  
23 with the Central American peace agreement signed in Guate-  
24 mala on August 7, 1987".
