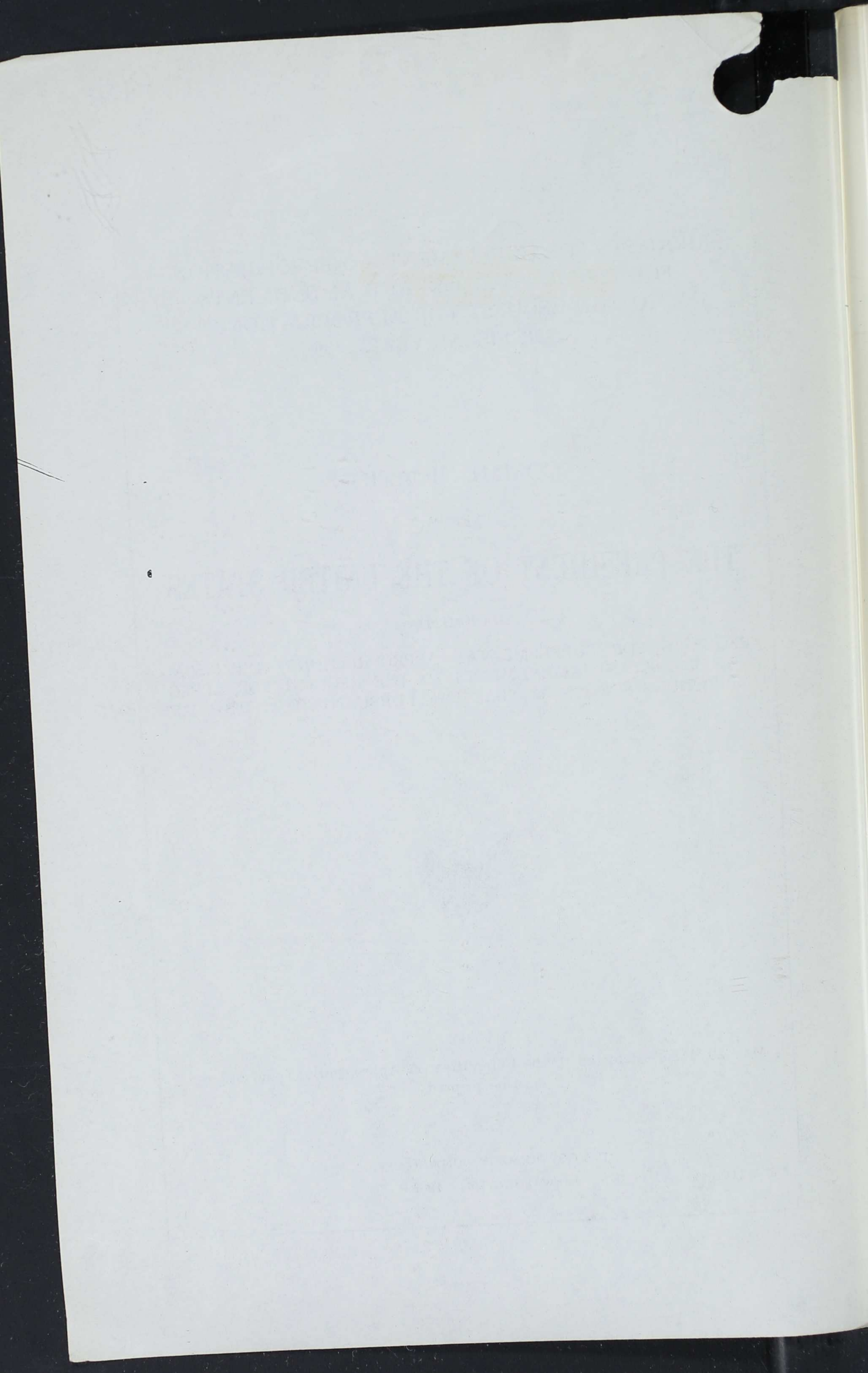

This proposal would provide additional security for the Supreme Court and would increase fiscal year 1986 outlays by \$200 thousand and fiscal year 1987 outlays by \$120 thousand.

UNITED STATES SENTENCING COMMISSION
Salaries and Expenses

For the salaries and expenses necessary to carry out the provisions of Chapter 58 of Title 28, United States Code, \$2,350,000, to remain available until expended.

This supplemental appropriation would provide funds to establish the United States Sentencing Commission to carry out the provisions of the Comprehensive Crime Control Act of 1984. The Commission would establish sentencing policies and practices for the Federal criminal justice system and develop means of measuring the degree to which the sentencing, penal, and correctional practices are effective in meeting the purposes of sentencing as set forth in Section 3553(a)(2) of Title 18, United States Code. This proposal would increase fiscal year 1985 outlays by \$2.1 million and fiscal year 1986 outlays by \$278 thousand.

FUNDS APPROPRIATED TO THE PRESIDENT
INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE

Functional Development Assistance Program

The Foreign Assistance and Related Programs Appropriations Act, 1985 as enacted in Public Law 98-473 is amended as follows: In the paragraph entitled "Population, Development Assistance", strike out from the third proviso "not less than \$46,000,000 or 16 percent" and insert in lieu thereof \$36,000,000, and strike out "whichever is lower,".

This language would permit the Agency for International Development to use \$10 million of funds, that otherwise would have been required to be obligated for the U.N. Fund for Population Activities, for other family planning activities. This proposal would not affect outlays.

This proposed reduction is possible because of the availability of \$15.0 million in deferred prior year unobligated balances to help fund fiscal year 1986 energy supply research and development activities. This proposal also reflects a \$5.0 million reduction in fiscal year 1986 funding for nuclear energy research resulting from schedule changes in the testing program. This proposal would reduce outlays by \$5.0 million in fiscal year 1986 and \$15.0 million in fiscal year 1987.

(In the appropriation language under the above heading, insert the following immediately after "oil and gas":)

: Provided further, That notwithstanding any other provision of law, funds appropriated under this heading in Public Law 97-394 and Public Law 98-473 for Western Hemisphere fuels facility studies and Kilngas demonstrations, which remain unobligated, shall be available for carrying out any fossil research and development activities.

The additional funds would provide for the maintenance of fossil energy research and development programs at planned levels in fiscal year 1986. These funds would replace prior year unobligated fund balances that were to be used for this purpose in fiscal year 1986 but are now needed for other purposes. This would result in an increase in fiscal year 1985 outlays by a total of \$3.6 million.

The appropriation language is requested to remove the requirement that certain fiscal year 1985 funds be spent for specific projects that are now scheduled for termination. This proposed language would make these funds available for other purposes.

: Provided, That the Federal Government's share of crude oil produced at Naval Petroleum Reserve Number 1 (Elk Hills) may be sold or otherwise disposed of, other than to the Strategic Petroleum Reserve, by the Secretary of Energy pursuant to the Naval Petroleum Reserve Production Act of 1976, notwithstanding the provisions of Section 160(d)(1) of the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (Public Law 94-163, as amended).

This proposal would permit continued operation of Naval Petroleum Reserve Number 1, including the sale of oil, without regard to the provisions of the Energy Policy and Conservation Act which specify that the reserve be "shut-in" if certain minimum requirements for filling the Strategic Petroleum Reserve are not met. This proposal would not affect budget outlays.

This proposed reduction reflects the deferral of unused fiscal year 1985 funds for use in fiscal year 1986 to cover the Southeastern Power Administration's (SEPA) need for Federal funding. This reduction also reflects lower funding needs resulting from recently negotiated power sales contracts. The utility operations of SEPA would not be affected. This proposal would reduce fiscal year 1986 outlays by \$41.0 million.

This request would provide for the consolidation of the headquarters operations of the Financial Management Service. At present, these operations are scattered among seven separate locations in the Washington, D.C. area. This consolidation plan, which was required by the Congress in the 1985 Continuing Resolution, would increase the efficiency and reduce the overhead costs of the Service.

This proposal also reflects reductions in the postage costs of the Service. These reductions totaling \$2.6 million in fiscal year 1985 and \$3.5 million in fiscal year 1986 are the result of an increase by the Postal Service in the discount for mailing presorted checks. The reduction in fiscal year 1985 partially offsets the cost of the consolidation of headquarters operations. This proposal would increase fiscal year 1985 outlays by a total of \$2.0 million and reduce fiscal year 1986 outlays by a total of \$2.1 million.

This request would further increase the limitation on the Board's administrative expenses by \$680,000 to enable the Board to cover higher costs of civilian pay. This proposal would not affect outlays.

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
