Barron Hilton Pioneers of Flight: Exhibition Evaluation Office of Policy and Analysis Smithsonian Institution December 2012¹

Background

Barron Hilton Pioneers of Flight (PoF) is a major exhibition in the middle of the south side second floor of the National Air and Space Museum (NASM) Mall Building, overlooking the Milestones of Flight gallery on the north side. PoF presents an eclectic assortment of aircraft and artifacts united by the fact that all were associated with aviators and aviatrix who pushed existing social and technological limits of flight. Each exhibit presents a pioneering step in 20th Century aviation, especially during the decades of the 1920's and 1930's. It covers accomplishments in military and civilian aviation. This exhibition tells the stories of the aviators who pushed existing limits.

NASM asked the Smithsonian Office of Policy and Analysis (OP&A) to conduct a study of visitor reactions to the exhibition, especially considering that a reinstallation emphasized activities for families. OP&A staff intercepted visitors exiting the exhibition.² Interviews were conducted on Thursday, July 12, Saturday, July 14, and Monday, July 16. Overall, 473 visitors were intercepted. 328 completed the survey for a participation rate of 69 percent.³

² *PoF* does not have defined doors to the exhibition; rather it has one side fully open to the hallway between *PoF* and *Milestones of Flight*. As a consequence, the OP&A staff interviewers were stationed near the western and eastern ends of the open side. Visitors were randomly selected as they left the exhibition. Visitors who looked at aircraft in *PoF* while walking in the hallway, or simply stepped a few feet into the exhibition and then moved on, were not intercepted. Since the flow was not constrained by an exit, OP&A did not follow the standard methodology of counting exiting visitors and weighting by flow.

³ 109 intercepted visitors refused to participate (23%) and 36 (8%) did not speak English or had another language difficulty that prevented them from participating.

Findings


Rating

Visitors were asked to rate their overall experiences at the *Pioneers of Flight* Exhibition on a five point-scale that has been applied by OP&A across Smithsonian exhibitions and museums: *Poor, Fair, Good, Excellent, and Superior*. In general, visitors who are basically satisfied with their visits tend to mark *Excellent*. Visitors who are critical tend to select one of the lower three categories—*Poor, Fair, or Good*. Those who have very positive responses tend to mark *Superior*.

Nearly four-fifths of the exhibition visitors said that their experiences were Superior (14%) or Excellent (64%). Overall, exhibition visitors gave *PoF* a higher rating compared to the average Smithsonian exhibition (Excellent and Superior combined; 67%). (See Figure 1.)


Rating of Overall Experience in Exhibition



Recommendation to Visit PoF

Half of the visitors at *Pioneers of Flight* "Definitely would recommend" (50%) this exhibition to families with young children. Less than one percent indicated that they would not recommend it to families.



Visitors at *Pioneers of Flight* translated their positive experiences into a strong propensity to say that they recommend the exhibition to visitors with young children. Three out of four visitors that marked the highest rating for the exhibition, "Superior" would "*Definitely*" recommend this exhibition to families with young children, the remaining one fourth probably would. About nine out of ten visitors who rated the exhibition as "Excellent," said that they "*Probably*" or "*Definitely*" would recommend this exhibition to families with young children (89%). The comparisons between Superior, Excellent, and Good or lower, are very striking regarding the willingness to "Definitely" recommend *PoF*, ranging from 29 percent for less satisfied visitors to 73 percent for the most satisfied.

What visitors did in Pioneers of Flight

Almost half of the visitors spent 15 minutes or less in *Pioneers of Flight* (46%). Nearly one in three visitors spent between 15-30 minutes (33%) and about one in five spent more than 30 minutes in the exhibition (21%).


There is a strong correlation between time spent in the exhibition and overall rating. Generally the more time a visitor spent in the exhibition the higher his or her overall rating. More than four out of ten visitors who said that they spent more than 30 minutes rated the exhibition as *Superior* compared with one-quarter of those who spent less than 15 minutes in the exhibition.⁵

⁴ The responses "Poor, Fair, Good" were combined into one category due to the small sample size for each group.

⁵ The large percentage of *PoF* visitors who reported spending more than a half hour in the exhibition seems impressive, anecdotally, however, OP&A does not have a database with statistics to reliably compare it with other Smithsonian exhibitions.

Pioneers of Flight Experience Rating by Time Spent in Exhibition




Respondents were asked to mark what they did in the exhibition. Most visitors viewed the Pioneer aircraft (67%), read panels with information (61%), and viewed Pioneer aviators' personal items (59%). Fewer than half used hands-on exhibits (44%), while about a quarter said that they used computer interactive exhibits (25%), watched a film (24%) or climbed the steps in the pylon viewing area (21%).

Visitors who used computer interactive exhibits, viewed pioneer aviators' personal items or watched a film expressed significantly more satisfaction (higher ratings). Likewise, visitors who said that one reason that they were visiting was because of the *Find Amelia Earhart Family Guide* were significantly more likely to rate their exhibition experience as "Superior."

Visitors accompanied by youth were significantly more likely to report engaging with hands-on exhibits, computer interactives, early childhood hangar area, climbing the steps to the pylon viewing area, and looking in the toy boxes, than visitors unaccompanied by children.

Asked to state their favorite part⁷ of *Pioneers of Flight*, visitors overwhelmingly volunteered Amelia Earhart (42%).⁸ Another 17 percent mentioned aviators other than Earhart and one-quarter mentioned aircraft or balloons (11% aircraft generally and 16% specific aircraft). The personal stories of the pioneer aviators struck a sympathetic chord among *PoF* visitors.



Enhancing the visit experience

Given the option of how to enhance their experiences in the exhibition by adding more or reducing features, the percentages selecting more of a feature were very similar across six features. Likewise, the percentage saying less was essentially zero for five features (about one in twelve said that fewer things for young children would have enhanced their experiences. Roughly three-quarters of the respondents said that the amount of five of the features were "about right" in the current design, while a quarter would like "more" and a very small percentage said "less. The largest percentages for "more" and "less" were *Things for young children* (30% more and 8% less).


While about one in three people felt "more" things for young children would enhance their experiences in *Pioneers of Flight* (30%), almost one in ten felt that "less" things for young children would enhance their experiences (8%). The presence of children in the visit group was a significant correlate of whether a survey respondent wanted "more" of "less" for young children, although for no other feature. Half of the survey respondents

visiting with children sought "more" (53% with a child under 9 and 46% with a child 9 to 12). Conversely, about one-out-of-seven respondents in an adult only group marked "more" (15%) and "less" (14%).

Why visitors were interested in visiting *PoF*

Visitors were asked "What made you interested in visiting this exhibition, *Pioneers of Flight* Today?" There were nine options available for responses; visitors were allowed to mark more than one response. Of the nine almost half of the visitors marked the option *just passed by while in the museum* (47%). The next two largest responses were to "Find Amelia Earhart" Family guide (21%) and Interest in Pioneers and their aircraft (27%). The options with the lowest responses were *A social media message, tweet, blog, etc.* (4%); *an article in a Parents magazine, etc.* (3%); A newspaper article (2%).

The absence or presence of children in a visit group was a key variable in the selection of a reason for visiting *PoF*. Respondents in adult only visit groups were significantly more likely to mention "Interest in Pioneers and their aircraft" (30% for adult only groups versus 24% for other groups) and "Just passing by" (53% for adult only groups vesus 43% for other groups). On the other hand, the adult only groups were significantly less likely to mention "Find Amelia Earhart Family Guide" (16% versus 25%), "Young children friendly activities and design" (5% versus 18%) and "interest in a specific aviation Pioneer" (7% versus 16%). Overall, visitors in groups with young children (under 9) were most likely to mention "Young child friendly activities and design" (27% versus 8% for other visitors). Visitors with elementary school age children (9 to 12) were significantly more likely to mention the "Find Amelia Earhart family guide" (31% versus 18%) and mention "Young child friendly activities and design" (19% versus 10% for other visitors).

Surprise at finding exhibits and programs for young children


Half of all respondents were surprised to find exhibits and programs for young children in *PoF* (51%). One in ten (11%) claimed to not be surprised because they already knew that *PoF* was designed for families with young children, and nearly a third said that they were not surprised because they considered that NASM, as a whole was designed for families (30%). Fewer than one in ten said that they did not see anything special for young children (8%). These responses were significantly correlated with the respondent's overall exhibition rating. About one-quarter of the respondents who rated their experiences as Poor, Fair or Good marked that they did not see anything special for families with young children (23%) compared with one out of twenty for more satisfied visitors (4% for Excellent and 5% for Superior ratings). At the same time, more satisfied visitors were more likely to say that they were surprised. Respondents who marked that they would recommend the exhibition to families with small children were more likely to say that they had been surprised, and less likely to report not seeing anything special for children.

Estimated time spent in *Pioneers of Flight*

Nearly half of all *PoF* visitors estimated spending less than 15 minutes in the exhibition (46%), a fifth said that they spent more than 30 minutes in the exhibition (21%). There were no significant differences between respondents based on visitor demographics. On the other hand, visitors who reported engaging with Hands-on exhibits or Computer interactive exhibits, Watching a film or Climbing the steps to the pylon viewing area spent significantly more time in the exhibition. Likewise, visitors who said that they visited because of the young child friendly activities and design spent more time, while those who visited while just passing by spent significantly less time in the exhibition.

Observations

The *Barron Hilton Pioneers of Flight* exhibition engaged most visitors to the extent that eight out of ten rated it as "Superior" or "Excellent." More than half spent more than 15 minutes in the exhibition and engaged in behaviors such as viewing the pioneers' aircraft and personal objects, reading panels and exploring hands-on exhibits. Even more important, the exhibition actively engaged a target audience of families with young children. This audience was more actively engaged with features of the exhibit design designed to appeal to it. Half of visitors accompanied by young children said that they would "definitely recommend" the exhibition to parents of young children, exactly the same as for all respondents. Combined with "Probably would" the favorable total is nearly nine out of ten, allowing little room for parents to be more supportive than other visitors.

Perhaps, one interesting observation is the extent to which the stories, and associated objects, of the aviation pioneers were the favorite parts of the exhibition, and, by assumption, the parts that will be most remembered. Amelia Earhart was the single most interesting pioneer. NASM had just begun participating in a multi-unit Smithsonian activity using the *Find Amelia Earhart Family Guide*. This guide was mentioned by a quarter of all respondents (including those unaccompanied by youth) as a reason for visiting. Additional multi-museum initiatives associated with prominent aviators may be a method to increase visitation at NASM in conjunction with other museums.
