DEAR MR. SPEAKER: By direction of the Committee on Appropriations, I submit herewith the Committee's report on the subdivision of budget authority and outlays. This report is consistent with the "Allocation of Spending Responsibility to House Committees Pursuant to Section 602(a) of the Congressional Budget Act—Fiscal Year 1997" as provided in the Conference Report, House Report 104-612, to accompany H. Con. Res. 178, establishing the Congressional Budget for the United States Government for the fiscal year 1997 and setting forth appropriate budgetary levels for fiscal years 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, and 2002.

The Committee on Appropriations has been allocated \$497.350 billion in discretionary budget authority and \$541.612 billion in outlays. The Committee, in distributing this among the 13 regular appropriations bills, has remained within the allocation.

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DEAR MR. SPARKS: By direction of the Committee on Appropriations, I submit herewith the Committee's report on the submission of budget authority and outlays. This report is consistent with the "Allocation of Budgeting Responsibility to House Committees Pursuant to Section 602 and the Congressional Budget Act—Fiscal Year 1997" as provided in the Conference Report House Report 104-612 to accompany H. Con. Res. 178, establishing the Congressional Budget for the United States Government for the fiscal year 1997 and setting forth appropriate budgetary levels for fiscal years 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, and 2002.

The Committee on Appropriations has been allocated \$27.350 billion in discretionary budget authority and \$21.812 billion in outlays. The Committee is distributing this among the 15 regular appropriations bills, as reflected within the allocation summary.
