AN ACT

Making supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending
September 30, 1984, and for other purposes.

- 1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any money
4 in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to provide
5 supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending
6 September 30, 1984, and for other purposes, namely:

2 CHAPTER I

3 DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT

4 HOUSING FOR THE ELDERLY OR HANDICAPPED FUND

5 Title I of the Department of Housing and Urban Devel-
6 opment-Independent Agencies Appropriation Act, 1984
7 (Public Law 98-45), is amended by inserting before the
8 period at the end of the paragraph under the heading "Hous-
9 ing for the elderly or handicapped fund" (97 Stat. 219, 220)
10 the following: ": Provided further, That notwithstanding sec-
11 tion 202(a)(3) of the Housing Act of 1959, loans made in
12 fiscal year 1984 shall bear an interest rate which does not
13 exceed 9.25 per centum, including the allowance adequate in
14 the judgment of the Secretary to cover administrative costs
15 and probable losses under the program".

16 EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT

17 COUNCIL ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY AND OFFICE OF

18 ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY

19 For an additional amount for the "Council on Environ-
20 mental Quality and Office of Environmental Quality",
21 \$600,000 to conduct a study to consider and define a Nation-
22 al Center for Water Resources Research, and a study to
23 define and plan a National Clearinghouse for Water Re-
24 sources Information.

1 *FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY*2 *SALARIES AND EXPENSES*

3 *The limitation on spending for official reception and*
4 *representation allowance for fiscal year 1984 contained in*
5 *the "Salaries and expenses" appropriation for the Federal*
6 *Emergency Management Agency in the Department of*
7 *Housing and Urban Development-Independent Agencies*
8 *Appropriation Act, 1984 (Public Law 98-45), is increased*
9 *from \$500 to \$2,000.*

10 *NATIONAL AERONAUTICS AND SPACE ADMINISTRATION*11 *CONSTRUCTION OF FACILITIES*

12 *For an additional amount for "Construction of facili-*

21 *cies Appropriation Act (Public Law 98-45), NASA may*
22 *enter into a contract with Morton Thiokol, Inc., to amortize*
23 *the Thiokol Casting Pit Covers over a twelve-year period for*
24 *a total cost of not to exceed \$23,000,000 under the authority*
25 *granted under Public Law 98-45.*

4 *time as authorized by law (the Emergency Veterans' Job*

6 *remain available until September 30, 1986: Provided, That*
7 *not more than \$25,000,000 of the amount appropriated shall*
8 *be available for transfer to the "Readjustment Benefits" ap-*
9 *propriation to administer the provisions of section 18 of*
10 *Public Law 98-77. Any unused portion of the amount so*
11 *transferred may be returned to this appropriation at any*
12 *time, but not later than December 31, 1984.*

17 GENERAL PROVISIONS

18 *SEC. 1201. The Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper of*
19 *the Senate (hereinafter in this section referred to as the "Ser-*
20 *geant at Arms") may designate one or more employees in the*
21 *Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper of the Senate*
22 *to approve, on his behalf, all vouchers, for payment of*
23 *moneys, which the Sergeant at Arms is authorized to ap-*
24 *prove. Whenever the Sergeant at Arms makes a designation*
25 *under the authority of the preceding sentence, he shall imme-*

1 diately notify the Committee on Rules and Administration in
2 writing of the designation, and thereafter any approval of
3 any voucher, for payment of moneys, by an employee so des-
4 igned shall (until such designation is revoked and the Ser-
5 geant at Arms notifies the Committee on Rules and Adminis-
6 tration in writing of the revocation) be deemed and held to be
7 approved by the Sergeant at Arms for all intents and
8 purposes.

9 *SEC. 1202.* Any provision of law which is enacted prior
10 to October 1, 1983, and which directs the Sergeant at Arms
11 and Doorkeeper of the Senate to deposit any moneys in the
12 United States Treasury for credit to the account, within the
13 contingent fund of the Senate, for "Miscellaneous Items", or
14 for "Automobiles and Maintenance" shall, on and after Octo-
15 ber 1, 1983, be deemed to direct him to deposit such moneys
16 in the United States Treasury for credit to the account,
17 within the contingent fund of the Senate, for the "Sergeant
18 at Arms and Doorkeeper of the Senate".

19 *SEC. 1203.* (a) Section 105(a)(2) of the Legislative
20 Branch Appropriation Act, 1968 (2 U.S.C. 61-1 (2)) is
21 amended to read as follows:

22 “(2) New or changed rates of compensation (other than
23 changes in rates which are made by law) of any such employ-
24 ee (other than an employee who is an elected officer of the
25 Senate) shall be certified in writing to the Disbursing Office

1 of the Senate (and, for purposes of this paragraph, a new rate
2 of compensation refers to compensation in the case of an ap-
3 pointment, transfer from one Senate appointing authority to
4 another, or promotion by an appointing authority to a posi-
5 tion the compensation for which is fixed by law). In the case
6 of an appointment or other new rate of compensation, the
7 certification must be received by such office on or before the
8 day the rate of new compensation is to become effective. In
9 any other case, the changed rate of compensation shall take
10 effect on the first day of the month in which such certification
11 is received (if such certification is received within the first
12 ten days of such month), on the first day of the month after
13 the month in which such certification is received (if the day
14 on which such certification is received is after the twenty-
15 fifth day of the month in which it is received), and on the
16 sixteenth day of the month in which such certification is re-
17 ceived (if such certification is received after the tenth day and
18 before the twenty-sixth day of such month). Notwithstanding
19 the preceding sentence, if the certification for a changed rate
20 of compensation for an employee specifies an effective date of
21 such change, such change shall become effective on the date so
22 specified, but only if the date so specified is the first or six-
23 teenth day of a month and is after the effective date pre-
24 scribed in the preceding sentence; and, notwithstanding such
25 sentence and the preceding provisions of this sentence, any

1 *changed rate of compensation for a new employee or an em-*
2 *ployee transferred from one appointing authority to another*
3 *shall take effect on the date of such employee's appointment*
4 *or transfer (as the case may be) if such date is later than the*
5 *effective date for such changed rate of compensation as*
6 *prescribed by such sentence."*

7 (b) *The amendment made by subsection (a) shall be ap-*
8 *plicable in the case of new or changed rates of compensation*
9 *which are certified to the Disbursing Office of the Senate on*
10 *or after January 1, 1984.*

11 SEC. 1204. (a) *The fifth sentence of subsection (e) of*
12 *section 506 of the Supplemental Appropriations Act, 1973 (2*
13 *U.S.C. 58(e)) is amended by striking out "or Minority*
14 *Whip" and inserting in lieu thereof "Minority Whip, Secre-*
15 *tary of the Conference of the Majority, or Secretary of the*
16 *Conference of the Minority".*

17 (b) *The amendment made by subsection (a) shall be*
18 *effective in the case of expenses incurred or charges imposed*
19 *on or after October 1, 1983.*

20 SEC. 1205. (a) *The Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper*
21 *of the Senate shall furnish each Senator local and long-dis-*
22 *tance telecommunications services in Washington, District of*
23 *Columbia, in accordance with regulations prescribed by the*
24 *Senate Committee on Rules and Administration; and the*
25 *costs of such service shall be paid out of the contingent fund*

1 of the Senate from moneys made available to him for that
2 purpose.

3 (b) Subsection (g) of section 112 of the Legislative
4 Branch Appropriation Act, 1978 (2 U.S.C. 58a) is repealed,
5 effective on the first day of the first calendar month which
6 begins more than thirty days after the date of enactment of
7 this Act.

24 For an additional amount for "Construction program",
25 \$1,500,000, to remain available until expended, for the Sec-

2 *operation of the Valley Division of the Yuma Reclamation*
3 *Project and to cover the accompanying relocation costs associ-*
4 *ated with the move. The cost of this work will be nonreim-*
5 *bursable and constructed features will be turned over to the*
6 *Yuma Valley Water Users Association for operation and*
7 *maintenance.*

8 DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY

9 ENERGY SUPPLY, RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

10 ACTIVITIES

11 *For an additional amount for "Energy Supply, Re-*
12 *search and Development" \$8,000,000, to remain available*
13 *until expended, of which \$4,000,000 shall be made available*
14 *to implement the four atoll health care plan authorized in*
15 *section 102 of Public Law 96-205 and \$3,000,000 shall be*
16 *for construction and operation of a second small community*
17 *solar energy project on the island of Molokai, Hawaii.*

18 ATOMIC ENERGY DEFENSE ACTIVITIES

19 *For an additional amount for "Atomic Energy Defense*
20 *Activities", for Project 77-13-f, ~~\$57,000,000~~ \$60,000,000,*
21 *to remain available until expended.*

22 *Of the funds appropriated for "Atomic Energy Defense*
23 *Activities" in Public Law 98-50, an amount shall be made*
24 *available to purchase 4 additional helicopters.*

1 (RESCISSION)

2 *Of the funds appropriated for "Atomic Energy Defense*
3 *Activities" in Public Law 98-50 for Project 82-D-109,*
4 *155 mm artillery fired atomic projectile, \$50,000,000 are*
5 *rescinded.*

6 NUCLEAR WASTE DISPOSAL FUND

7 For an additional amount for "Nuclear Waste Disposal
8 Fund", \$12,000,000, to remain available until expended, to
9 be derived from the Nuclear Waste Fund. To the extent that
10 balances in the fund are not sufficient to cover amounts avail-
11 able for obligation in this account, the Secretary shall exer-
12 cise his authority pursuant to section 302(e)(5) of *Public Law*
13 *97-425* to issue obligations to the Secretary of the Treasury.

14 CLINCH RIVER BREEDER REACTOR

15 *Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act and for*
16 *funding the Clinch River Breeder Reactor project authorized*
17 *by section 106 of Public Law 91-273, as amended:*

18 *For construction and operation of the Clinch River*
19 *Breeder Reactor project, \$1,500,000,000, to be available*
20 *until expended but contingent upon commitments, satisfac-*
21 *tory to the Secretary of Energy, for utility and private sector*
22 *financial participation for a minimum of 40 per centum of*
23 *the Department of Energy estimate of remaining capital costs*
24 *as reported to Congress on March 15, 1983. In addition to*
25 *the amounts herein appropriated and in consideration for*

1 *such financial participation and notwithstanding any other*
2 *provision of this Act, the Secretary is authorized to contract*
3 *incontestably to (1) provide to participants ownership inter-*
4 *ests in the project, products, services and/or revenues from*
5 *the project, (2) repay funds invested by the participants sub-*
6 *sequent to the passage of this Act, plus interest, if the project*
7 *is not completed, not licensed for operation, or terminated at*
8 *any time, (3) insure revenues from the project for the repay-*
9 *ment of debt, (4) indemnify participants against changes in*
10 *Federal tax laws affecting their financial participation in the*
11 *project, and (5) indemnify participants and the operator*
12 *against uninsured liabilities with respect to the project. Such*
13 *contracts may be assigned and shall be enforceable against*
14 *the United States in accordance with their terms except in*
15 *the case of fraud by the assignee. Participation in the project*
16 *shall not subject a participant to regulation under the Public*
17 *Utility Holding Company Act of 1935. All moneys received*
18 *by the Secretary under this heading may be retained and*
19 *obligated for the purposes of the project and shall remain*
20 *available until expended. Of the \$1,500,000,000 appropri-*
21 *ated by this heading, up to \$270,000,000 may be obligated*
22 *during fiscal year 1984, of which \$135,000,000 may be obli-*
23 *gated notwithstanding any other provision of this heading;*
24 *and up to the following amounts may be obligated during the*
25 *following fiscal years: \$285,000,000 during 1985;*

1 \$290,000,000 during 1986; \$290,000,000 during 1987;
 2 \$185,000,000 during 1988; \$75,000,000 during 1989;
 3 \$105,000,000 during 1990 and beyond.

13 ~~SEC. 101.~~ No part of the funds appropriated under this
 14 Act or any other provisions of law may hereafter be used by
 15 the Department of Justice to represent the Tennessee Valley
 16 Authority in litigation in which the Authority is a party.

17 ~~SEC. 102~~ 1301. Within funds available to the Corps of
 18 Engineers—Civil for Operation and Maintenance, General,
 19 not to exceed \$2,000,000 shall be used to rehabilitate, re-
 20 store, and refurbish the Corps of Engineers dredge vessel
 21 Kennedy, to transport the vessel to New Orleans, Louisiana,
 22 and there to operate, maintain, and display the vessel for the
 23 duration of the 1984 Louisiana World Exposition. Such oper-
 24 ation, maintenance, and display shall include the preparation

1 and use of audio-visual and other exhibits to inform the public
2 of Corps of Engineers water resources activities.

3 SEC. ~~103.~~ (a) 1302. The Secretary of the Army is au-
4 thorized *for a period of two years beginning with enactment*
5 *of this Act*, with the concurrence of the Director of the Na-
6 tional Park Service and the South Florida Water Manage-
7 ment District, to modify the schedule for delivery of water
8 from the central and southern Florida project to the Ever-
9 glades National Park required by section 2 of the River Basin
10 Monetary Authorization and Miscellaneous Civil Works
11 Amendments Act of 1970 (Public Law 91-282) and to con-
12 duct an experimental program for the delivery of water to the
13 Everglades National Park from such project for the purpose
14 of determining an improved schedule for such delivery.

15 (b) ~~The Secretary of the Army shall, as soon as practi-~~
16 ~~eable, make such modifications in the comprehensive plan for~~

18 ~~ida, authorized by the Flood Control Act of 1948 and subse-~~
19 ~~quent Acts of Congress, as may be necessary to restore the~~
20 ~~natural flow of water to the Everglades National Park. The~~
21 ~~Secretary is further authorized to acquire such interests in~~
22 ~~lands as are necessary to permit the natural flow of water to~~
23 ~~the Everglades National Park, at an estimated cost of~~
24 ~~\$75,000,000. The Secretary shall acquire any interest in~~
25 ~~land under this subsection at the fair market value of such~~

1 interest based on conditions existing after the construction of
2 the project described in subsection (a) of this section and
3 before any modification is made to the schedule for delivery
4 of water to the Everglades National Park under such subsec-
5 tion and before the restoration of such natural flow. The Sec-
6 retary is also authorized to construct necessary flood protec-
7 tion measures for protection of homes in the area affected by
8 any modification of such delivery schedule or by the restora-
9 tion of such natural flow.

10 SEC. ~~104~~ 1303. The Secretary of the Army, acting
11 through the Chief of Engineers, is directed to utilize available
12 construction general appropriations to complete bank protec-
13 tion works at Wheeling Island, West Virginia, in the Hanni-
14 bal Lock and Dam pool, at an estimated cost of \$135,000
15 and to complete the local flood protection project at Russell,
16 Kentucky, at an estimated cost of \$600,000.

17 SEC. ~~105~~ 1304. The Secretary of the Army, acting
18 through the Chief of Engineers, is directed to utilize available
19 general investigation funds to initiate a study of alternatives
20 to the Mentone Dam of the Santa Ana Mainstem project in
21 California and the flood control study of the Illinois River
22 between Henry and Naples, Illinois.

23 SEC. 1305. Funds available or hereafter made available
24 for the Red River Waterway Project shall be used to provide
25 for construction of a high level replacement bridge for the

1 *Louisiana and Arkansas Railway Company near Alexan-*
2 *dria, Louisiana, pursuant to an agreement between the Chief*
3 *of Engineers and the Railway Company and upon terms and*
4 *conditions acceptable to the Chief of Engineers in the interest*
5 *of navigation and the expeditious prosecution of the Project.*
6 *Federal costs of the bridge replacement, including design and*
7 *construction, shall be limited to \$24,270,000 (July 1, 1983*
8 *price levels), with an adjustment to this amount, if any, as*
9 *may be justified by reason of a fluctuation in the cost of*
10 *construction as indicated by the Engineer News Record's ap-*
11 *plicable construction indices, plus the cost of necessary real*
12 *estate interests to be acquired by the Corps of Engineers,*
13 *which interests may be conveyed to the Railway Company.*

14 *SEC. 1306. Section 116(a) of the Rivers and Harbors*
15 *Act of 1970 (Public Law 91-611) is amended by adding at*
16 *the end thereof the following:*

17 *“Those areas of the river between Howard Street*
18 *and Caldwell Avenue in Niles, Illinois, that have ac-*
19 *cumulated silt and side bank sloughing should be exca-*
