Per your inquiry of April 11, 2019, Smithsonian Institution Scholarly Press does not intend to reprint or otherwise reissue *Inua: Spirit World of the Bering Sea Eskimo*, by Susan Kaplan and William Fitzhugh. In an effort to facilitate potential opportunities for future publication and distribution of this or another edition of the work, we are reverting rights to this title pursuant to the 'Out of Print' clause or to the term of duration clause in the publishing and/or distribution agreement (Agreement) between you and the Smithsonian Institution Press.

Smithsonian hereby grants the National Museum of Natural History a reversion of all rights originally granted by the museum to Smithsonian Institution Press under the Agreement (or any Addendum to the Agreement) for the work titled INUA: SPIRIT WORLD OF THE BERING SEA ESKIMO. By accepting this reversion, you acknowledge and agree that the parties have fully and faithfully executed all obligations pursuant to and under the Agreement, that there are no further obligations by either party to the other, and that the Agreement is terminated.
