NEW LABORATORY/CONFERENCE CENTER AT THE TIVOLI SITE

STRI Director Ira Rubinoff has announced the confirmation by Mr. Glenn O. Tupper of San Jose, Costa Rica that the Tupper Foundation will make a grant to STRI in the amount of four million dollars for the construction of a laboratory/conference center at the Tivoli Site.

The new laboratories and conference center will facilitate innovative research at STRI and will honor the creativity and invention of the late Earl S. Tupper. The new complex, scheduled for completion in 1987, will also include a dining facility, and outdoor cages and plant growing areas.

The EARL S. TUPPER RESEARCH AND CONFERENCE CENTER will create a campus like facility, foster interaction among scientists, and provide closer access to the library for a larger proportion of our scientific community. Also it will provide new laboratories and adequate parking and storage for staff and visiting scientists. The partial consolidation of research activities will also help to facilitate custodial, security, computing, procurement and editorial services at STRI.

AID GRANTS PROGRAM IN SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

AID announces a new grants program to support new and innovative research. Funding decisions are made on the basis of 4 criteria: scientific merit, relevance to development, innovativeness, and improvement of scientific capabilities in countries receiving AID development assistance. The topics considered are biotechnology/immunology, plant biotechnology, chemistry for world food needs, biomass resources conversion tehenology, biological control, ocean and earth sciences and genetic resources. A 2-3 page pre-proposal is required and the deadline for submission is 1 February 1985. Guidelines are available from G. de Alba at Ancon.
