NEWS FROM THE HILL

By a vote of 87 to 13, the U.S. Senate recently approved the House of Representatives science facilities bill, an authorization for the Smithsonian to plan and construct a new base camp in Arizona for the Astrophysical Observatory and the Tupper Center and other new constructions at STRI. The bill now goes back to the House, and if accepted, will go on to the President for signature.

Budget Update

No congressional action yet on the FY 1987 budget. Matching funds for the Tupper Center are part of STRI's FY 87 budget request.

Although Gramm-Rudman-Hollings legislation was recently declared unconstitutional reducing the threat of automatic across the board cuts, budgetary reductions are still expected in FY 87.


