Last Saturday, March 1st, representatives of 10 groups interested in conservation participated in a meeting that was held at the Ancon Conference Room and organized by the STRI Office of Conservation. The purpose of this meeting was for these groups to get to know one another and to join forces in future conservation efforts. Representatives of the following groups participated: Asociación para la Protección y Conservación del Ambiente, Asociación Nacional para la Conservación de la Naturaleza (ANCON), Defensores de la Naturaleza de Penonomé, Grupo de Tecnología Apropiada, Asociación de Técnicos Forestales de Panamá, Sociedad Audubon, Sociedad de Investigaciones Biologicas de la Universidad de Panamá, Sociedad Americanista para la protección del Medio Ambiente, Grupo Vicentino Amigos de la Flora y Fauna, Asociación Cristobalina Pro-Recursos Naturales (the latter three are secondary school groups organized by Julio Jaen).

The meeting was attended by 40 persons belonging to the various conservation groups and the staff of the STRI Office of Conservation, and a future meeting of these groups is being planned for April.
