PET REGISTRATION

As you may have read in the U.S. Southern Command, The Spillway or the Announcement #3 from the STRI Office of Conservation, RENARE has passed a resolution that you must register all wild animals kept in captivity as pets. (This excludes dogs, cats, domestic farm animals, as well as laboratory animals.) The pets must be registered by April 30th, and the registration forms are now available at the STRI Office of Conservation.

Dr. Carl B. Koford, former director of the Canal Zone Biological Area, died Dec. 3rd, 1979. The Carl B. Koford Memorial Fund has been established, and proceeds from the fund will be used to sponsor field research on vercebrates in accordance with the wishes of Dr. Koford.
