SLIDE PRESENTATION ON !!LAS GAVIOTAS'' AT ANCON CONFERENCE ROOM

On Wednesday, April 9th, at 2:30 p.m. in the Ancon Conference Room, Ing. Samuel Bern, Coordinator of the GRUPO DE TECNOLOGIA APROPIADA, will give a slide presentation on his visit to "GAVIOTAS", in Colombia.

Everett G. Martin of The Wall Street Journal described the GAVIOTAS experiment as follows:

"Here on the lonely tropical savanna of

'Here on the lonely tropical savanna of the Orinoco River basin, 300 miles from the nearest town, a colony of youthful Colombian engineers and scientists has created a gadgeteer's paradise.

Some of the gadgetry may end up being so much scientific doodling, but the goal of the enginners and scientists who shuttle between this research center and the capital, Bogota, is highly serious. It is to produce techniques that are tailor-made for the small farmers and settlers whom the government hopes to attract to the hot grasslands, an area about the size of Nebraska whose thin soil is low in nutrients because they are easily washed away by rain.

....At the same time, the planners don't want to destroy the delicate environment by plowing up the thin soil; by cutting down the streamside trees (that keep the soil from being even more depleted by the rains) for fuel; or by destroying the grass cover.

What the technicians of Las Gaviotas have accomplished so far has applications beyond Colombia, and the technicians are in constant demand to explain their work to other tropical countries that want to develop similar areas. The work fits in well with the "appropriate technology" theory, which holds that most of the technology of the industrialized nations is too sophisticated and expensive for the needs of poor nations and that more suitable technologies are therefore required.
