COOPERATIVE TECHNICAL AGREEMENT SIGNED

An agreement of technical cooperation to encourage the development of research activities on the West Bank of the Panama Canal Watershed was signed on Saturday, November 21, 1981 by the Minister of Agricultural Development of Panama, Dr. Alfredo Oranges; Ing. Irving Diaz, Director of RENARE; Dr. Rodrigo Tarte, Director of the Institute of Agricultural Develoment; Dr. Gerardo Budowski, Director of CATIE in Costa Rica, and Dr. Ira Rubinoff. The research on the West Bank will hopefully accomplish 3 main goals: 1) encouragement of preservation and utilization of Panama's natural resources in a sustainable manner, 2) provide an opportunity for STRI scientists to engage in field trials of some of the theoretical studies in which they have been involved for many years, for example, the rearing of iguanas, agoutis, and experiments with the process of forest succession, and 3) encourage activities along the West Bank of the Panama Canal Watershed which are compatible with the long-term status of the Barro Colorado Nature Monument.
