**Center for Tropical Forest Sciences Awarded**

The Center for Tropical Forest Science has just received a grant of \$520,000 from the National Institute of Health to conduct tropical forest research, including the installation of a 50-hectare forest Dynamics plot, in Korup National Park, Cameroon, in Central Africa. The CTFS project is part of a \$2 million International Cooperative Biodiversity Group program led by the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research of Washington D.C. The program aims to foster the conservation of tropical forest biodiversity through the discovery and development of new drugs from rainforest plants and animals. Other members of the consortium include the University of Pittsburgh, the University of Nigeria-Nsukka, University of Yaounde (Cameroon), Bristol-Myers Squibb, and Shaman Pharmaceuticals. The program will include the collection of medicinal plants based on traditional ethnobotanical knowledge, isolation and testing of active compounds, and drug development by participating pharmaceutical companies. The CTFS component will assess the sustainability of harvest of 60 known medicinal woody plants that occur in the area of the plot. In addition the National Museum of Natural History Biodiversity Program and the SI-MAB Program will conduct conservation training courses in Cameroon. The program will also promote the cultivation by small farmers of the liana *Ancistrocladus korupensis*, source of a compound which has been found to inhibit the HIV virus, and which is endemic to the Korup area.

For this position the candidate should be someone who does studies on systematics of terrestrial arthropods (insects, spiders, ticks, etc.) and able to teach courses in General Biology and Entomology. ### **Interpretación Ambiental Marina**

Durante los días 19 y 22 de noviembre, Argelis Ruiz Guevara y Cindy Martin de la Oficina de Educación, organizaron un curso de interpretación ambiental marina para el entrenamiento de docentes. El grupo de trece docentes que participaron servirán de guía a los muchos grupos estudiantiles que visitan semanalmente el Centro de Ciencias Marinas en Culebra, y Laboratorios Marinos de Naos desde 1992. Hasta la fecha, más de 6,000 estudiantes se han beneficiado de este programa de visitas interpretativas, las cuales han sido atendidas por Argelis Guevara, Cindy Martin y Arcadio Rodaniche. Como resultado de la gran acogida recibida por la comunidad en Panamá y del interior del país, especialmente la estudiantil, fue necesario aumentar el número de docentes para cubrir el intenso programa de visitas.

El curso se diseñó para entrenar a los participantes a interpretar su entorno natural y usar métodos de aprendizaje a través de vivencias prácticas. Como parte del entrenamiento, los estudiantes asistieron a conferencias por Haris Lessios, Nancy Knowlton, Amalia Herrera, Conrado Tapia, John Christy, Ursula Schober, y Georgina de Alba. El nuevo grupo de docentes para el Centro Marino de Culebra comenzará a laborar en enero, luego de cumplir tres sesiones de práctica en el campo.


