*Red Queen, Dead Queen?*

### Abstract

I will review the theoretical foundations of the idea that sexual reproduction is a response to selection pressures posed by coadapted parasites. I will then review the status of the empirical support for this idea. Finally I will discuss how population structure of host and parasite populations is expected to influence the coevolutionary dynamics of these processes.

The Panama Canal Commission informs STRI personnel and visiting scientists who conduct studies and observations in the old Gamboa Road and/or surrounding areas to exercise caution due to the initiation of work by PCC on the East Bank, which will require the use of explosives. The exact dates for the construction activity will be announced in the near future. At that time access to the Old Gamboa Road will be restricted. Nevertheless, access by STRI personnel with I.D. will be honored whenever possible. This is an early warning to allow researchers to plan accordingly if needing to use this area.

The gates at the Tivoli employee parking lot have been outfitted with remote control arms capable of exerting 3000 lb. each while opening or closing. For personal safety, pedestrians will not be allowed through those gates when the doors are normally closed. In order to accommodate the high pedestrian traffic at specific times during the day, those doors will be kept open for vehicles and pedestrians during the following time intervals:

- 7:30am-08:30am ■ 11:45am-1:15pm ■ 4:15pm-5:30pm.

■ 11:45am-1:15pm ■ 4:15pm-5:30pm.



##### Molecular Genetic Approaches in Conservation

The 75th annual meeting of the Pacific Division and the American Association for the Advancement of Science will hold a symposium on the molecular genetic approaches in conservation on June 21-22, at San Francisco State University, California. "With the loss of biodiversity has also come the realization that conservation strategies must not only focus on patterns of biotic diversity but also on the biological processes producing it. Recent advances in molecular biology are proving useful in making informed conservation management decisions for threatened and endangered species. The symposium will bring together many of the leaders in the emerging field of molecular conservation genetics. The

objectives are to summarize and discuss results of recent research utilizing molecular techniques in conservation biology.
