STRI Delegation at Expo Lisbon '98 Delegación de STRI en Expo Lisboa '98

The Panamanian pavilion at Expo '98, in Lisbon, is a great success, with six to eight thousand daily visitors. One of the major features of the stand is the STRI's exhibit, "One Isthmus and Two Oceans", which greets the visitors right at the entrance, drawing enormous attention. On June 17, Luis D'Croz and Stanley Heckadon, accompanied by the Panamanian Ambassador in Portugal, Lourdes Phillips, the Panamanian delegate to the Expo and Elena Lombardo, delivered lectures to the staff and students of the Universidade Moderna in the Old Quarters of Lisbon. Both STRI scientists were extensively interviewed by Radio Nacional de España and news agency EFE, who prepared several news items on Panama and STRI participation at the Fair, for the Spanish speaking world ... 
