- Valery Terwilliger, University of Kansas, Dec 16 - Jan 7, to study the resource use variations of fast growing trees in Panama, in Gamboa.


Michael Greenfield, University of Kansas, Dec 16 - Jan 7, to work with Valery Terwilliger, in Gamboa.
