## REMINDER FOR NEW VISITORS

EVERY person who is in the Republic of Panama for more than 30 days must have a PAZ y SALVO to leave the country. Ms. Elena Lombardo, Tivoli Office can arrange to get this for you if notified at least 10 work days in advance of departure date. EVERY person who leaves after 30 days must also have an EXIT PERMIT. Staff and long-term visitors with Special Residency Permits also have Multiple Entry/Exit permits, but will need to get another exit permit for the last departure, when association with STRI terminates.
